If you are arriving for an Assessment WHEN AN ASSESSMENT IS HAPPENING PLEASE WAIT WHERE DIRECTED WHILE THE PREVIOUS GROUP LEAVES TO WE CAN REMAIN UNDER THE 100 THRESHOLD FOR THESE EVENTS –

PLEASE KEEP ADDITIONAL PEOPLE TO A MINIMUM (especially unvaccinated under 12 years and 3 months) BUT WE DO RECOGNISE THAT THE BOYS WILL NEED A SUPPORT PERSON WITH THEM WHILE THEY ARE BEING ASSESSED.

Year 6 and 8 assessments will take place at St Andrews College Nets (MAP BELOW) Year 7 Assessments will be held at the OBC Nets – please give yourself plenty of time to find a park – you can access the nets either via the Prep School entrance on Normans Road or via the carpark adjoining the Elmwood Tennis Club on Heaton Street (there is a gap between the trees taking you onto the back fields at St Andrews).

OBC Nets can be access via Elmwood Park

- PLAYERS SHOULD WEAR TRAINING ATTIRE OR THEIR NORMAL SATURDAY CLUB GEAR
- No spikes should be worn.
- Please bring your own gear.
- If you need to borrow gear most clubs will loan you some kit from their Saturday gear – just wear your normal cricket gear or what you normally train in. Bring a filled drink bottle – go to the toilet before you come to your assessment!

Please report to the Admin Station to receive your NUMBERED BIB and ALSO FIND OUT WHICH OF THE 4 LANES YOU WILL BE IN.

Players and spectators are reminded to practice SAFE NETS – please be aware of not turning your back on the active nets.

**ONLY BOYS AND THE LANE ASSESSORS/GRADE CO-ORDINATORS AND ASSISTANTS  
SHOULD ENTER THE MAIN NET AREA**

**THERE IS PLENTY OF SPACE AROUND THE OUTSIDE OF THE NETS AND YOU CAN BE READY TO ASSIST WITH GETTING  
GEAR ON AND OFF**

Each boys should receive a bat for approx. 7 minutes – batters will be assessed on technique so best to show your range of shots and play each ball on its merits – towards the end of your bat you may be asked to show more attacking shots so you can show more of your skills.

Bowlers should concentrate on showing their control of line and length and spinners the range of deliveries you currently have. Don't try too hard – just relax and do your best!!!!

Wicket keepers MAY be asked to have stints behind the wickets or in a separate lane where movement, hand eye co-ordination and current skills will be assessed so we allocate enough keepers to each team for the tournament.

**AGAIN PLEASE BORROW GEAR CLUB GLOVES/HELMETS IF YOU DON'T HAVE YOUR OWN.**

## **Post Assessments**

After the Assessments our Year Group Volunteers will meet and work out how many teams they can form and construct these teams.

## **VENUES**

**Year 6** – Polo Grounds (South Hagley Park) – On Day 1 **REPORT TO THE BIG TREE FOR A SHORT BRIEFING**

**Year 7** – Warren Park – Artificial pitches

**Year 8** – Burnside West Christchurch University Grounds (grass pitches)

**IN YEAR 6 AND 7 EVEN TEAMS ARE BEING SELECTED OUT OF THESE ASSESSMENTS**

**IN YEAR 8 GRADED TEAMS WILL BE SELECTED – HIGHER GRADED TEAMS WILL PLAY AGAINST EACH OTHER AND PLAYERS IN THE OTHER 4 TEAMS WILL HAVE THE OPPORUTNITY TO DEVELOP BEFORE THE SPRING FESTIVAL.**

Fringe players who miss the Higher graded teams have an opportunity build confidence, score runs, take wickets and demonstrate they warrant consideration at a higher level. Parents play a vital role in encouraging enjoyment regardless of which team a player is selected in.

ONLY YEAR 8 IN THE 2021 SUMMER TOURNAMENT WILL BE GRADED TEAMS OTHER YEARS WILL BE EVEN TEAMS. Each year group can decide when they make the move to graded teams and this will be decided leading into the next tournament in Spring.

This also allows for new players to CICA Tournaments to be placed at an appropriate level so where possible “like vs like” environments are created.

## JANUARY 2023 FESTIVALS

In January 2021 and 2022 an additional Festival was held at the same time as the traditional Year 8 turning Year 9 South Island event – Associations were encouraged to enter more teams so any Boys who did want to play in this larger Festival would be put into teams. 16 additional teams from the South Island entered in 2021 and 22 teams in 2022 and the CJCA contributed 10 of these FOUR being Year 8 (Turning Year 9) teams and SIX younger Year 7 (Turning Year 8 teams) – all the boys had a good cricketing experience.

In Year 6 (turning 7) a Festival will be held in January of 2023 which all players will be able to register for – these are multiple day events held either in Christchurch or Mandeville, Ohoka, North Canterbury or both and aim to utilise the School holidays to extend the cricket these boys get to play and prepare them for future multi day events they may wish to play in. Both these Festival are 4 day events - this Festival is a blend of Coaching and six 20/20 games

January 2023 will see similar events held – it is hoped that dates and venues for these events will be confirmed mid-year so parents can consider holiday plans and any leave required to be taken

## YEAR 6

Please note that the General Manager of the CJCA will have a short briefing of all parents not directly involved in the delivery of the Assessments when the Boys are called into the Nets for their assessments at 10am, 11am and 12 noon.

This aims to give parents an outline of the process the CJCA uses and its Strategic Aims and Values. They will remain available to answer any questions after this 5-minute briefing.

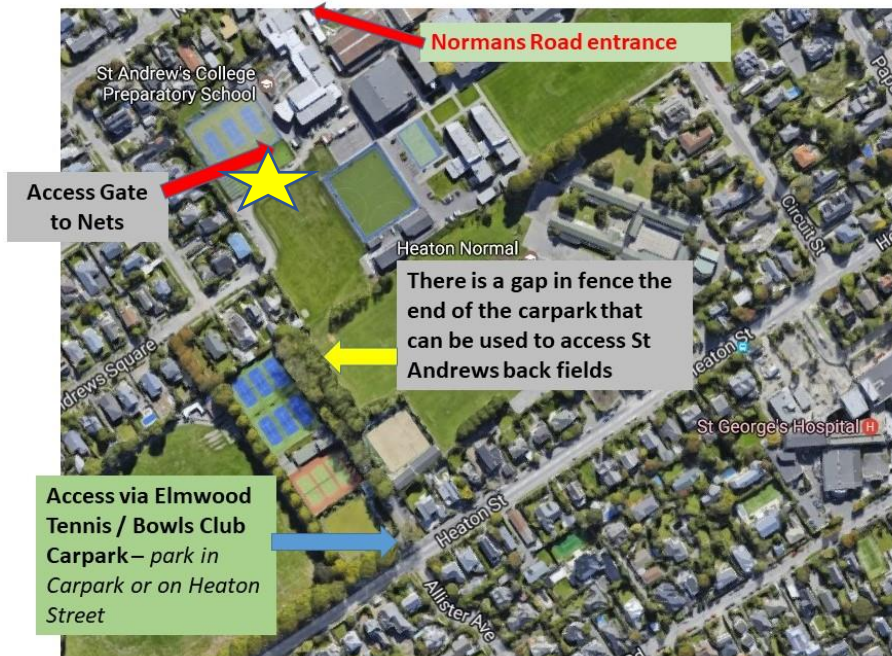
