Where it can start

The first programme you may be able to participate in is our **Pre-season Training Programme**. This highly regarded programme features 6 weeks of 90 minute sessions held indoors on either Saturdays or Sunday from the 9th & 10th of August until the end of the Term.



This programme uses best practice skill acquisition coaching which aims to prepare players for their Year 6 Club season and CJCA Festivals. Squads of 12 are led by 2 paid coaches providing a low-ratio opportunity to develop skills and build confidence.

Spaces are limited to 48 in each Year group and are generally over-subscribed.

REGISTRATIONS FOR THIS PROGRAMME OPEN IN JUNE 2025 – Payment for the programme can be made at any time but should be paid by the **9th of August**.

Parents interested in assisting the paid coaches are welcome to help in sessions to learn more about what they can bring into their own coaching.

Parental involvement in Festivals



Without parental involvement in our **Festival Programme** we would not be able to run our Festivals. THIS IS ASSISTANCE ON THE DAY WITH TEAM MANAGEMENT, WARM UP AND SCORING.

We aim to have at least two parents per team to help these newly formed teams enjoy 3 days of Cricket initially in our Spring and subsequent Festivals.

Spring Festival for Year 6's will feature two 16/16 games of pairs cricket per day between teams formed after players complete an "Assessment" where we can assess where players are currently in terms of their development. Prior to this we will build a group of parents with the skills to run a Lane at the Sir Richard Hadlee Centre on Sunday the 5th of October

ASSESSMENTS AND FESTIVAL LEAD IN

Each boy who enrolls will select a time for an hour assessment (times TBC) where they will get a numbered bib, and bat and bowl so we can create EVEN teams for the Festival which will start the following Sunday and run for 3 weeks.

Boys need to bring their own gear or borrow gear from Clubs – most Clubs will allow boys to borrow gear from Saturday team kit until they have their own.

Lane Assessors who generally will take teams in the Festivals then met and equally arrange the boys into groups ensuring that the volunteer parents, wicket keepers and boys of varying abilities are equally spread amongst teams – this creates some great matches and allows for the boys to interact with other boys from different clubs making new friends along the way.

YEAR CONVENOR/S

Each intake such as this requires a **Convenor or Convenors** to assist this intake through the 2 ½ season that make up the CJCA system – these Convenors look to build a group of like-minded parents to create a group of between 60-80 boys who want more cricket than just their Saturday cricket. The Convenors are asked to become members of the CJCA Executive a group that meets 9 times a year either in person or on Zoom to assist in the delivery of the CJCA's aims.

The Convenor role has worked best with two joint Convenors – so if you have a more administrative background or a more cricketing background that often works well.

CJCA FESTIVALS

Spring Festival – October/November – 3 Sundays

January Festivals – January School Holidays 3 or 4 day Festivals

Summer Festival – February/March – 3 Sundays

These Festivals provide a great opportunity for Players regardless of what section they play on Saturday to play with other motivated boys who want to play more cricket.

These games are umpired by Youth boys who have all played so know the nerves of the boys.



Even teams are created for CJCA Sunday Festivals and for Year 6 boys play two 16/16 games so bat in Pairs for 4 overs. Everyone should bowl a couple of overs and boys will get to interact with boys from different clubs. In addition to the Cricket benefits the social benefits of learning be part of a new team compared with their Saturday teams is one of the Highlights. Parents are required to assist with scoring and managing the teams – all the set up on PlayHQ is done by the CJCA and the match gear – wickets, scoreboards, boundary markers, balls are all sorted!!
